Child Protection Training for Designated Liaison Persons



This training will equip you with the knowledge and skills required to effectively perform the role of Designated Liaison Person. Participants **must** have completed one day Children First, Child Protection Training in the past 3 years.

A strong working knowledge of Children First 2017 is required. This training is based on current legislation, national guidance and best practice outlined in Children First 2017, the Children First Act 2015 and the Child Care Act 1991.



Duration:

Delivered as a Full Day, e.g. 10am - 5pm

Format:

Webinar or Workshop

Group size:

16 participants per training

The course will involve presentation, video, case studies and group exercises. Participants receive a Certificate of Attendance.



Following the training, participants will be able to:

- Recognise their legal responsibilities in relation to Child Protection
- List the signs and symptoms of abuse
- Explain the role of the designated liaison person in supporting staff and managing child protection situations
- Demonstrate how to speak with parents effectively when child protection concerns arise
- Identify best practice in relation to child protection recording and reporting
- Describe how to deal with allegations of abuse against staff members
- State organisational responsibilities re; child safeguarding

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
